## Firsts in Acts 11

- A church sent a preacher (previously, the apostles in Jerusalem sent Peter and John to Samaria)
- Disciples called Christians
- Elders
- Relief sent to elders of other churches

## Acts 11:27-30

- A famine: secular history, per Josephus: famine during reign of Cuspius Fadus and Tiberius Alexander
  - Fadus was Herod's successor
  - Josephus speaks of Fadus buying corn from Egypt to relieve Jews in Judea
  - Herod died 44 AD
  - If secular history is correct, then we would have the events of 11:27-30 (the famine) occurring after 12:1-23 (Herod's death)

## Acts 11:27-30

- Who contributed?
- Who were the recipients?
- Would saints be the only ones affected by a famine?
- Was the sending of relief a temporary setup or a permanent program?
- What was the role of Paul and Barnabas?
- Were there multiple churches in Judea?

# Bible Approach to Caring for Needy Saints

- Christians taking care of own family members
  - 1 Timothy 5
- A church taking care of its own members
  - Acts 2, 4, 6
- When a church had members in need beyond its ability, then a church or churches sent to the needy church so that the needy church could relieve its own
  - 1 Corinthians 16:1–3

# Caring for Needy Saints

- The church relieving needy saints:
  - Acts 2:44–45
  - Acts 4:34–35
  - Acts 6:1-4
  - Romans 15:25–31
  - 1 Corinthians 16:1–3
  - 2 Corinthians 8:1–14
  - 2 Corinthians 9:1–14
  - 1 Timothy 5:16
- In each case
  - Who contributed?
  - Who was relieved?
  - Who administered the relief?

## Acts 11:27-30

- Relief from saints for saints
  - "relief to the brethren dwelling in Judea" (v.29)
  - Consistent with pattern seen so far in Acts
    - Acts 2, 4, 6
- Will not find in New Testament: the church providing relief for unbelievers
  - Does not deny the truth of James 1:27 regarding individual action
- No sponsoring church here (Jerusalem they say)
  - Churches of Judea:
    - Acts 9:31, 32, 36
    - Gal 1:22/Acts 9:30 (this was prior to Acts 11)
- A temporary arrangement specific to a need

# Each church doing its own work

- Sent out and/or supported preachers
  - Acts 11:22
  - Philippians 4:15–18
- Cared for its own needy
  - Acts 4:32–35
- Collected and sent out its own funds for relief of needy saints
  - 1 Corinthians 16:1–3
  - Acts 11:27–30
  - 2 Corinthians 8:4-6, 16-21
- Came together for worship
  - Acts 20:7
  - 1 Corinthians 11:17–22, 14:1–40
- Determined fellowship and carried out discipline
  - Acts 9:27
  - Acts 18:26–27
  - 1 Corinthians 5:1–13
    - 2 Thessalonians 3:6–7, 14–15
