The Return Trip

- The shortest route by far back to Antioch would be through the Cilician Gates.
- Returned through the cities of persecution
 - Courage
 - Others' spiritual need about their own physical saftey
- Matthew 28:18-20

Strengthening The Souls of the Disciples

- Establishing, grounding
 - In the truth
 - Example, teaching, appointing elders
- Exhorting to continue in the faith
 - Then it is possible to discontinue in the faith!
- Through many tribulations must enter the kingdom of God
 - Idolaters?
 - Angry Jews?
 - Family ties, social ties?
 - Temptations

- To receive everlasting kingdom in heaven
 - 2 Peter 1:11
- We must
 - Grow in the faith
 - Endure tribulation
 - Revelation 2:10

"Appointed Elders in Every Church"

- Acts 11:30
- Plurality
- Will learn much more through the New Testament
 - Harmonizing all the facts
 - Acts 20:28
 - 1 Peter 5:1–3
 - Qualifications in Titus and 1 Timothy
- Commended them (the disciples) to the Lord
 - "Entrusted"
 - Matthew 28:20

Back in Antioch

- Where...
 - They had been commended to the grace of God for the work
 - A work they had completed
- Reported...
 - All that God had done with them
 - That God had opened the door of faith to the Gentiles
 - Began with preaching to Jews; became a trip where Gentiles were receiving the Word
- Stayed there a long time with the disciples

- Salamis
 - Island of Cyprus
 - Barnabas & John Mark
 - 13:4-5
 - Preached in the synagogues
- Paphos
 - Island of Cyprus
 - Barnabas & John Mark
 - · 13:6-12
 - Taught Sergius Paulus, the proconsul
 - Elymas struck blind
- Perga
 - Region of Pamphylia
 - 13:13
 - John Mark left them and returned to Jerusalem
 - Acts 15:38

Antioch

- Region of Pisidia, part of Galatia
- Paul and Barnabas
- · 13:14–52
- Preached in the synagogue
- Gentiles receptive; Jews rejected
- Persecuted and expelled from the region
- 2 Timothy 3:11

Iconium

- Lycaonia, part of Galatia
- Paul and Barnabas
- · 14:1-6
- Preached in the synagogue
- Jew and Gentile believed, but Jews poisoned minds of the brethren
- P&B waxed bold and continued preaching with signs confirming
- Violent attempt to abuse and stone
- 2 Timothy 3:11

Lystra

- Lycaonia, part of Galatia
- Paul and Barnabas
- 14:7-20
- Lame man healed
- Preached to idolaters
- Jews from Antioch and Iconium came and stoned Paul; left for dead outside the city
- 2 Tim 3:11; Acts 16:1; 2 Timothy 1:4 2 Timothy 1:2; 1 Corinthians 4:17; 2 Corinthians 11:25

Derbe

- Lycaonia, part of Galatia
- Paul & Barnabas
- 14:20-21
- Made many disciples
- Acts 20:4

- Return trip:
 - Lystra
 - Iconium
 - Antioch of Pisidia
 - Strengthened the souls of the disciples
 - Exhorting them to continue in the faith
 - Appointed elders in every church
 - Commended them to the Lord
 - Perga
 - Preached here this time
 - Attalia
 - Antioch of Syria
