


Overview of Third Preaching Trip


- Acts 18:23-21:17
- Approximately 2800–3000 miles
- ▶ About 4–5 years
- Have been to these cities or regions so far
 - Galatia
 - Phrygia
 - "upper regions"
 - Ephesus
- Now on to
 - Troas
 - Macedonia
 - Greece
 - And then return trip to Jerusalem

Return Trip - On His Way to Jerusalem

- Many men accompanied him (20:4)
 - Very possibly messengers of the churches carrying the relief to the needy saints in Jerusalem
 - 1 Corinthians 16:3
 - 2 Corinthians 8:18–21
 - What churches have been instructed regarding making a contribution for the needy saints in Jerusalem?
 - Galatia 1 Corinthians 16:1
 - Corinth 1 Corinthians 16:1
 - Macedonia 2 Corinthians 8:1



Sailing Across the Aegean



Last Week

- Verses 4&5
 - Many who accompanied Paul went on ahead to Troas
 - from Achaia, or
 - From Macedonia
- Paul and Luke went by land through Macedonia
- From Philippi, they sailed to Troas to meet up with the others (20:5-6)
- Left Philippi after the Days of Unleavened Bread
 - March/April
 - Remember Paul writing to Corinth from Ephesus that he would remain in Ephesus until Pentecost (May/June)?
 - 1 Corinthians 16:8
 - This is about 1 year later

On the First Day of the Week...

- Troas: "where we stayed seven days"
 - Even though Paul is "hurrying to be at Jerusalem, if possible, on the Day of Pentecost" (Acts 20:16)
- On the first day of the week, when the disciples came together to break bread, Paul, ready to depart the next day, spoke to them and continued his message until midnight"
- "break bread"
 - Can mean common meal Acts 2:46, but that does not fit the context and meaning of Acts 20:7
 - Lord Supper 1 Corinthians 10:16
 - Acts 2:42
- The disciples came together on the first day of the week to break bread

The First Day of the Week

- Its significance
 - The day the Lord Jesus was raised from the dead
 - Mark 16:9
 - The church established
 - Isaiah 2:2
 - The day that the gospel was preached, beginning in Jerusalem
 - Acts 2
 - Isaiah 2:3
- A day already established by teaching
 - 1 Corinthians 16:1–2
 - Not just Corinth, but also Galatia
 - 1 Corinthians 4:17
- No other day singled out in Acts regarding worship
 - Not to be confused with Paul reasoning with Jews on the Sabbath to teach them the gospel of Jesus Christ


The Events of Acts 20:7–13

- The disciples came together on the first day of the week to eat the Lord's Supper
- Paul intended to depart the next day
- Paul preached to them, continuing until midnight
- Eutychus fell from the 3rd story window
- Paul went down, fell on him, and embraced him...
- Paul came up, ate, talked a long while until daybreak, and then departed
- Others had gone ahead to the ship to sail to Assos where they were to pick up Paul (verse 13)

From Troas to Miletus

- Troas and Assos on opposite sides of a peninsula
 - 20 miles apart by foot
 - 40+ miles by ship around the coastline and cape

Assos, Mitylene, Chios, Samos, Trogyllium, Miletus

- From Mitylene next day came opposite Chios
- Next day arrived at Samos; stayed at Trogyllium
- Next day came to Miletus



Meeting with the Elders from Ephesus

- Reminders, Instructions, Warnings, and Exhortations
- "You know...what manner I always lived among you"
- Paul's example!
 - Serving the Lord
 - with all humility
 - With many tears and trials

Paul's Example

- Kept back nothing that was helpful, but proclaimed it to you
 - Publicly
 - House to house
- Testifying to Jews & Greeks repentance toward God and faith toward our Lord Jesus Christ
- Not moved by these things
 - Trial awaits him in Jerusalem
 - Chains and tribulation
 - But the outcome?
 - Unknown

Paul's Example

- Does not count his life dear to himself
 - Revelation 12:11
- Determined to finish his race (course) and the ministry
 - Acts 26:16–18
- Did not shun avoid declaring to the Ephesians the whole counsel of God
 - Therefore:
 - Innocent
