

Last Week

- ▶ Paul and others received by the church in Jerusalem
 - Received gladly
 - Paul told in detail the work of God among the Gentiles through his ministry
 - They glorified the Lord
- ▶ False reports of Paul
 - That he teaches all the Jews among the Gentiles
 - To forsake Moses, saying
 - They ought not to circumcise their children
 - They ought not to walk according to the customs
- ▶ The proposal
 - Take the four men who have taken a vow, be purified with them, and pay their expenses so that they may shave their heads
 - Will show the accusations against Paul to be false
- ▶ It has already been made clear to believing Gentiles that they should observe “no such thing”, except...
 - Acts 15:29

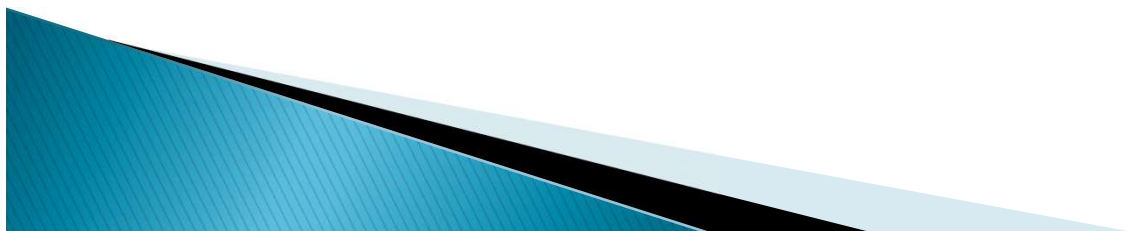


The Jerusalem Mob

- ▶ Incited by lies about Paul, including a supposition
- ▶ Paul drug out from the temple, sought to kill him, beat him
- ▶ Commander of the garrison or cohort – Claudius Lysias (23:26)
 - Garrison – 1000 men + 120 horsemen
 - 1 / 6 of a legion
 - Ten centuries under him, each with their centurions

Paul addresses the Jerusalem mob

- ▶ The commander thought Paul was an Egyptian who raised up an insurrection in the past
- ▶ Paul identifies himself as being from Tarsus and asks to speak to the people
- ▶ Standing on the stairs of the barracks, he motions with his hand and speaks to the Jews in the Hebrew language
- ▶ Respectfully, “men, brethren, and fathers”



Who is this Paul?

- ▶ Jew
- ▶ Of Tarsus of Cilicia
- ▶ Taught by Gamaliel in Jerusalem according to the law of Moses
- ▶ Zealous toward God
 - “as you are today”
- ▶ Philippians 3:5–6
- ▶ The things Paul did in good conscience
