What are two sides of authority?

- The R \_ \_ \_ or P \_ \_ to rule or command
- To A \_ \_ by the instruction and/or approval of the rightful ruler
- If you have not been given the A\_\_\_\_Y to do a thing, then you don't have the R\_\_\_\_ to do it. You may have the P\_\_\_\_ (as in the ability), but that does not mean you have the R

## When gathering the facts & harmonizing them...

- ☐ The facts must be understood
  - □ John 20:9
- ☐ The facts need to be accepted as truth
- □ Even if the harmonized facts present a difficulty in our mind, that does not prove the conclusion wrong
  - ☐ Matthew 22:23-33
  - Note two problems:
    - □Did not understand the Scriptures
    - □Did not understand the power of God
  - ☐ Other examples?

## Gathering all the facts from the Bible includes

- ☐ Statements, declarations, commands
- ☐ Approved examples
- Necessary conclusions

# Baptism: Gathering all the facts & harmonizing them

- ☐ With all the Scriptures, we could learn the answers to the following questions:
- Who is a candidate for baptism
- ☐ What baptism is; the mode
- ☐ In what medium baptism is performed
- What baptism accomplishes
- When one should be baptized

## What's wrong here?

- ☐ Ephesians 2:8-10
  - ☐ Therefore, we are saved by grace and faith only.
  - ☐ Have you not read James 2:24, among other verses?
- □ John 3:16
  - ☐ Therefore, we are saved at the point of belief, without or before baptism
  - ☐ Have you not read 1 Peter 3:21, among other verses?

- ☐ Truth does not contradict truth
- We must take all of what God has said
- We must harmonize those facts in order to come to the right conclusion
- □ John 8:32
