•Verse 1:

Jesus spoke this parable that...

- Men always ought to pray,
- And not lose heart

- The unjust judge
 - Did not fear God nor regard man (v.2)
- The widow & her plea
 - Avenge me of my adversaries (v.3)
 - Continual coming (v.4, 5)
- The unjust judge decides to respond
 - His motives (v.5)
