INTRODUCTION TO 1ST CORINTHIAN LETTER

- ► <u>Background:</u> The church was established on Paul's second journey during his 18 month stay
- ▶ When: A.D. 56 About 3-4 years after the church was established
- ► Where: From Ephesus, possibly in the spring between Passover and Pentecost (1 Cor 5:7; 16:8) On Paul's third journey
- ► <u>Theme:</u> Admonition for unity in the faith. Written to correct irregularities and abuses prevailing I the church over matters such as dealing with an immoral brother, lawsuits, problems about marriage, eating meat offered to idols, abuses of the Lord's Supper, improper attitudes about spiritual gifts, and heresies about the resurrection.

INTRODUCTION TO 2ND CORINTHIAN LETTER

- ▶ When: A.D. 57 Within a year after 1 Corinthians letter was sent
- ► Where: From Philippi (Macedonia), (2 Cor 7:8; 9:4) On Paul's third journey
- ► Theme: 2 Cor 2:14-17 Paul's expression of joy at their reception of his first letter and his defense as an apostle of Jesus Christ against the false accusations of Judaizing teachers. This is the most personal of all his letters, giving us insight into his feelings, desires, dislikes, ambitions, and obligations.

INTRODUCTION TO LETTER TO THE ROMANS

- ► When: A.D. 57 On Paul's third journey within months of writing 2nd Corinthian letter
- ▶ Where: From Corinth (Acts 20:3; Rom 16:1, 23; 1 Cor 1:14)
- ▶ Theme: Rom 2:11 God is no respecter of persons

Rom 1:16 – The gospel is God's power unto salvation to everyone that believes. This letter primarily answers the question, "Can a Gentile be a Christian without first becoming a Jewish proselyte?" Judaizing teachers had insisted that Gentiles must also be circumcised and keep the Law of Moses.

INTRODUCTION TO LETTER TO THE GALATIANS

- ► When: A.D. 57 On Paul's third journey about the same time he wrote the letter to the Romans and roughly 11-12 years after these churches were established.
- **▶ Where:** From Corinth
- ► <u>Theme:</u> Gal 3:26-29 Justification by faith in Christ. After proving his apostleship was of Christ, Paul taught that salvation by faith in Christ is independent of the works of the Law of Moses.

INTRODUCTION TO LETTER TO THE GALATIANS

- ▶ When: A.D. 57 On Paul's third journey about the same time he wrote the letter to the Romans and roughly 11-12 years after these churches were established.
- ► Where: From Corinth
- ► <u>Theme:</u> Gal 3:26-29 Justification by faith in Christ. After proving his apostleship was of Christ, Paul taught that salvation by faith in Christ is independent of the works of the Law of Moses.
