THOUGHTS ON PAUL'S NAME...

► Who changed Saul's name to Paul?

- Luke Acts 13:9, "But Saul, who was also known as Paul..."
- Saul is Hebrew meaning "desired or asked for", is a name for greatness or great stature
- Paul is Latin meaning "little", is a name for small or weak
 - ▶ 1 Cor 15:9 Least of the apostles, unworthy to be called an apostle...
 - ▶ 2 Cor 10:1,10; 12:10 I who am meek...
- It was common for Jews of that day to have two names, one Jewish and one Gentile

Paul's relationship with the Galatian churches

- ▶ 1st Journey, Paul and Barnabas
- Preaches 1st recorded sermon in Acts 13:16-41, in Antioch of Pisidia
- Paul says, "we are turning to the Gentiles" (Ax 13:46)
- They received opposition from the Jews and were ran out of town
- ► A divided community...Ax 14:1-24
 - Multitude divided 1-7
 - Mistaken for gods vs 8-18
 - Paul stoned and was supposed dead vs 19-20
 - Strengthened souls and appointed elders in every church vs 21-24



Paul's relationship with the Galatian churches

- 2nd Journey, Paul, Silas and Timothy; 2-4 years after 1st visit with them
- Picked up Timothy in Lystra/Derbe Acts 16:1-2
 - Timothy joins Paul and Silas on their journey
 - Paul circumcised Timothy because of the Jews vs 16:3
- ► They delivered the decrees from the Jerusalem meeting on circumcision vs 16:4-5
- They passed through the Phrygian and Galatian region vs 16:6
- ► 3rd Journey, Paul, Titus?, Timothy?,
 - They pass through the Galatian region and Phrygia vs 18:23





- When: A.D. 57 On Paul's third journey about the same time he wrote the letter to the Romans and roughly 11-12 years after these churches were established.
- ► <u>Where:</u> From Corinth
- Theme: Gal 3:26-29 Justification by faith in Christ. After proving his apostleship was of Christ, Paul taught that salvation by faith in Christ is independent of the works of the Law of Moses.

► <u>Outline:</u>

- Paul is an Apostle through Jesus Christ and not after man (ch1-2)
- Justification is by faith in Christ and not by the works of the law of Moses (ch3-4)
- Exhortations to steadfastness and faithfulness to responsibilities of a Christian (ch5-6)
- Paul's object was to defend his apostolic commission and authority, and to bring his readers to a conviction regarding the freedom that Christian's have from circumcision and the Mosaic law through the justification arising from God's grace through faith in Jesus Christ.
