- The church of Christ is composed of the saved
 - Acts 2:47
- Those in the kingdom are the redeemed
 - Colossians 1:13-14
 - The church was purchased with the blood of Christ
 - Acts 20:28
 - 1 Peter 1:19
- The saved are in Christ
 - Romans 6:3
 - Galatians 3:26-27
- All spiritual blessings are in Christ
 - Ephesians 1:3

What must one do to be saved?

- Hear the Gospel
 - John 6:44-45
 - Romans 10:17
 - The gospel is God's drawing power
- Believe
 - Hebrews 11:6
 - Acts 2:36
 - Mark 16:16
 - Faith vs. Opinion
 - Faith is produced by hearing (Romans 10:17)
 - Faith requires testimony
 - Without testimony, then opinion
 - Jeremiah 10:23
 - Based upon the testimony of the New Testament, one must believe:
 - The gospel, God's power to save (Romans 1:16)
 - That Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God and the Savior of man (John 8:24)

What must one do to be saved?

- Repent
 - Acts 2:38
 - Acts 17:30
 - Repentance is a change of mind
 - Matthew 21:28-29
 - Godly sorrow works repentance
 - 2 Corinthians 7:10
 - Repentance results in a change of action
 - Matthew 21:29
 - Here is a difficult point for many
 - Many will profess to believe in Christ, but they will not do His will
 - What's lacking? They need to repent change their minds.
 - When one repents, then obedience can follow.
 - But it is getting one to renounce his own will that is difficult
- Confess
 - Romans 10:9-10
 - One must confess that Jesus is Lord and Christ, the Son of the living God

What must one do to be saved?

- Be baptized
 - Mark 16:16
 - Baptism is a burial in water
 - Romans 6:3-5
 - Acts 10:47
 - Baptism is for salvation
 - 1 Peter 3:21
 - Baptism is for remission of sins, to wash away sins
 - Acts 2:38
 - Acts 22:16
 - Baptism puts one into Christ
 - Galatians 3:26-27
 - Belief is unto righteousness (Romans 10:10)
 - Repentance is to salvation (2 Corinthians 7:10)
 - Confession is unto salvation (Romans 10:10)
 - Baptism is into Christ
 - Baptism is into one body
 - 1 Corinthians 12:13
- At this point, one is saved, in Christ and in the church that belongs to Christ.
- Now he must remain faithful unto death so that he can receive the eternal inheritance
 - Revelation 2:10

- Jesus taught what one must do to be saved
 - Matthew 28:19-20; Mark 16:16
- The apostles taught what Jesus taught
- The New Testament record demonstrates and exemplifies what Jesus and His apostles taught
- Any other plan or way to be saved is not of God but is of human design and origin

Therefore, to those accountable:

- If you haven't done what Jesus and His apostles taught in order to be saved, you are not saved
- If you are not saved, you are lost
- If you are lost, you are not a member of the body, the church
- If you are lost, then you have no hope of heaven but instead a fearful expectation of fiery judgment
- If you have obeyed the teaching of Christ and His apostles about how to be saved, you are saved and are a member of His body, His church
- If you are saved, then you are in Christ wherein are all spiritual blessings
- If you are lost, then you are outside Christ, not a member of His church, and outside of all spiritual blessings

Responsibility of Membership in the Church

- First, make the distinction between the use of the word church in a universal sense and in the local sense
- When saved, then added by the Lord to the church in the universal sense
 - Acts 2:47
- Received by other Christians in the church in a local sense
 - Acts 9:26-28
 - Acts 18:27
 - 1 Corinthians 1:2; Galatians 1:2; Philippians
 1:1; 1 Thessalonians 1:1

Responsibility of Membership in the Church

- Colossians is an excellent epistle to see many responsibilities of the saved
 - Colossians 2:5-7
 - Good order and steadfast in faith
 - Walk (live) in Christ
 - Be established and grow in the faith
 - Abounding in thanksgiving
 - Beware of error
 - Colossians 1:9-12
 - Filled with knowledge and understanding
 - Walk worthy of the Lord
 - Fruitful in every good work
 - Increasing in knowledge
 - Strengthened in patience, longsuffering, joy, and thanksgiving
 - Colossians 1:2; 3:12-17
 - Joined with other Christians in love
 - Colossians 3
 - Put off old man and put on new
 - Every relationship affected
 - Colossians 4:5-6
 - An influence for righteousness in the world

What about responsibility in the local church?

- Joint participation, fellowship
 - 1Corinthians 11, 14

Individual's Responsibilities in the Local Church as Seen in 1 Corinthians

- Be free from divisiveness (chapter 1)
- Stand firmly upon only the word of God (chapters 2, 4)
- Build up the body through teaching others (chapters 3, 4)
- Live morally upright and righteously (chapters 5-7)
- Have concern about the conscience of others (chapters 8, 10)
- Join with brethren in proper worship (chapter 11)
- Respect each other's place and importance (chapter 12)
- Be filled with love (chapter 13)
- Seek spiritual edification of brethren (chapter 14)
- Be filled with hope (chapter 15)
- Sacrifice in support of the collective work (chapter 16)
