Ephesians 1:15-23

- A prayer for their enlightenment or illumination
 - Not miraculous
 - Realize the extent of God's power
 - Very similar prayer in Colossians 1:3-12
- Perhaps 5 years since Paul was in Ephesus
 - Very interested in their spiritual health

Two Key Characteristics of the Saints

- Faith
- Love
- Galatians 5:5-6
- 1 Thessalonians 1:2-3

Paul's Prayer for the Saints

- 1. That God may "give to you the spirit of wisdom and revelation in the knowledge of Him"
 - Define: spirit, revelation, knowledge
 - Colossians 1:9
- How will this happen and for whom?
 - Ephesians 3:5
- Result?
 - "Eyes of your understanding being enlightened"

Paul's Prayer for the Saints

- 2. That "you may know what is the hope of His calling"
- What are the benefits of hope for Christians?
- 3. That you may know "what are the riches of the glory of His inheritance in the saints"
- What are the qualities of His inheritance?

Paul's Prayer for the Saints

- 4. That you may know "what is the exceeding greatness of His power toward us who believe, according to the working of His mighty power..."
 - More of this described in chapter 3
 - Note all the superlatives His power, working, mighty, power
- What does this have to do with our resurrection?

Four Great Works in Christ Showing God's Power

• Verses 20-23

- 1. Raised Christ from the dead
- 2. Made Him sit at His right hand
- 3. Put all things in subjection to Him
- 4. Gave Him to be head over all things to the church
