2 Peter 1:16-21

"For we did not follow cunningly devised fables, when we made known unto you the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, but we were eyewitnesses of his majesty. For he received from God the Father honor and glory, when there was borne such a voice to him by the Majestic Glory, This is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased: and this voice we ourselves heard borne out of heaven, when we were with him in the holy mount.

And we have the word of prophecy made more sure; whereunto ye do well that ye take heed, as unto a lamp shining in a dark place, until the day dawn, and the day-star arise in your hearts: knowing this first, that no prophecy of scripture is of private interpretation. For no prophecy ever came by the will of man: but men spake from God, being moved by the Holy Spirit."

Revelation & Inspiration: An example from Jeremiah

- 1:9 "My words in your mouth"
- 1:17 "speak to them"
- 2:1-2 the words Jeremiah spoke were the words of God: "Thus says the Lord..."
- 36:1-2 God commanded Jeremiah to the write "all the words that I have spoken"
- 36:4 Jeremiah instructed Baruch to write "all the words of the Lord which He had spoken to him"
 - 36:17-18 Baruch did just that
- 36:8 the book with all those words was produced (and read from)
- 36:10-11 the words of Jeremiah = the words of the Lord

The Scripture originated with God, was transmitted to man by the power of God, was first spoken by Jeremiah, and then put into written form. What he spoke and what he wrote were verbally inspired.
