The Holy Spirit and truth

- The Holy Spirit revealed all truth.

 - Confirmed established, showed to be true
 - Jesus' words confirmed through wonders, signs, and miracles
 - The apostles' words confirmed through accompanying signs
- 2 Timothy 3:16-17
 - All Scripture is breathed out by God inspired
- God spoke by the Holy Spirit by the mouth of the prophets, and those things were written

The Holy Spirit and miraculous spiritual gifts in apostolic days

- Miraculous spiritual gifts had been promised
 - Joel 2:28-32
 - Mark 16:17-20
- The apostles had the miraculous through the baptism with the Holy Spirit
- Christians other than the apostles would have miraculous spiritual gifts only through the laying on of the apostles' hands
 - Acts 8:14-17; 19:5-6; 2 Timothy 1:6
 - Exception: Cornelius' household the miraculous administered from heaven, but unique purpose (Acts 11, 15)

Acts 2

- The Holy Spirit convicted and converted Jewish sinners through inspired, confirmed truth – through the gospel
- The baptism of the apostles with the Holy Spirit revealed and confirmed the truth.
 - No other baptism of Jews with the Holy Spirit ever occurred.
- A gospel sermon was preached words were given by the Spirit to save sinners (vss. 4, 11, 22, 40, 41)
- Jews were convicted and converted by the words of a confirmed revelation – by the power of the gospel (vss. 37-41)
 - "Now when they heard this"
- No mysterious or miraculous power was exerted upon the sinner. The Spirit worked on the sinner through the words of truth.

- Acts 3
 - Peter preached vs.12ff
 - Convicted men of murder vss. 13-15
 - Urged them to repent and turn vs. 19
 - Told of forgiveness in Christ vs. 26
 - Result:
 - "Many of them which heard the word believed" (4:4)

- Acts 7
 - Stephen preached
 - But the audience resisted the Holy Spirit who was trying to convict and convert them (vs.51)
 - How did they resist the Holy Spirit?
 - By refusing the word

- Acts 8 the Samaritans
 - "But when they believed Philip as he preached..."
- Acts 8 the Ethiopian
 - Philip "opened his mouth, and beginning at this Scripture, preached Jesus to him"
- Act 9 Saul
 - "Arise, and go into the city, and it will be told what you must do"
- Acts 10,11 Cornelius & his household
 - "Peter, who will tell you words by which you and all your household will be saved"
- Acts 16 Lydia
 - "Spoke to the women..."; "...Lydia heard us"

- Acts 16 the keeper of the prison
 - "Then they spoke the word of the Lord to him and to all who were in his house"
- Acts 18 the Corinthians
 - "And many of the Corinthians, hearing, believed and were baptized"
- Acts 17 the Bereans
 - "...received the word with all readiness"
- Acts 19 the Ephesians
 - "In Him you also trusted, after you heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation" (Ephesians 1:13)

The Gift of the Holy Spirit

- Acts 2:38-39
 - Then Peter said to them, "Repent, and let every one of you be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins; and you shall receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. For the promise is to you and to your children, and to all who are afar off, as many as the Lord our God will call."
- Acts 2:21
 - "And it shall come to pass that whoever calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved."
 - The promise to whoever calls upon the name of the Lord is salvation
- In the context, the gift of the Holy Spirit to be received is the promise to all the Lord will call, and the promise to all who call upon the Lord is Salvation – "shall be saved"

Romans 8:2-14

- For the law of the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus has made me free from the law of sin and death. For what the law could not do in that it was weak through the flesh, God did by sending His own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh, on account of sin: He condemned sin in the flesh, that the righteous requirement of the law might be fulfilled in us who do not walk according to the flesh but according to the Spirit. For those who live according to the flesh set their minds on the things of the flesh, but those who live according to the Spirit, the things of the Spirit. For to be carnally minded is death, but to be spiritually minded is life and peace. Because the carnal mind is enmity against God; for it is not subject to the law of God, nor indeed can be. So then, those who are in the flesh cannot please God. But you are not in the flesh but in the Spirit, if indeed the Spirit of God dwells in you. Now if anyone does not have the Spirit of Christ, he is not His. And if Christ is in you, the body is dead because of sin, but the Spirit is life because of righteousness. But if the Spirit of Him who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, He who raised Christ from the dead will also give life to your mortal bodies through His Spirit who dwells in you. Therefore, brethren, we are debtors—not to the flesh, to live according to the flesh. For if you live according to the flesh you will die; but if by the Spirit you put to death the deeds of the body, you will live. For as many as are led by the Spirit of God, these are sons of God."
- Are you in the flesh literally? If you are alive, then you are in the flesh literally.
 - If "in the flesh" is literal, then nobody alive can please God!
- Living in the flesh: Figurative. Not literal. Walking according to the flesh; setting mind on things of the flesh (fleshly minded); not living subordinate to, subjecting self to, the law of God

Romans 8:2-14

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- Living in the flesh was not literal; why would the opposite living in the Spirit be literal?
- Living in the Spirit and the Spirit dwelling in you: Figurative. Not literal. Walking
 according to the law of the Spirit; setting mind on things of the Spirit (1 Corinthians 2:14);
 living subordinate to or in subjection to the law of God; led by the Spirit of God; sons of
 God
- Spirit is in you, Christ is in you
