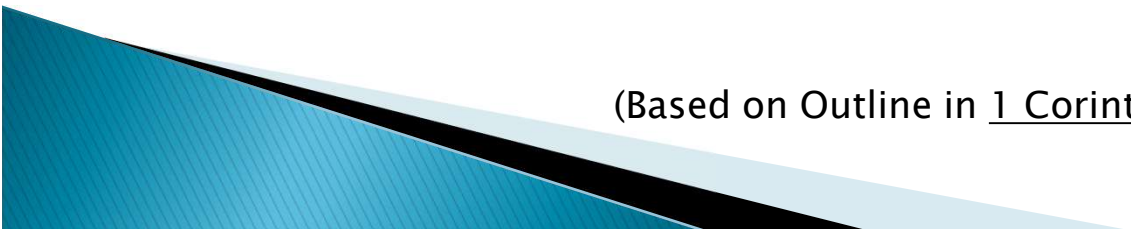

1 Corinthians 12:1–3

“Now concerning spiritual gifts, brethren, I do not want you to be ignorant: {2} You know that you were Gentiles, carried away to these dumb idols, however you were led. {3} Therefore I make known to you that no one speaking by the Spirit of God calls Jesus accursed, and no one can say that Jesus is Lord except by the Holy Spirit.”



1 Corinthians 12:4–7

“There are diversities of gifts, but the same Spirit.

{5} There are differences of ministries, but the same Lord.

{6} And there are diversities of activities, but it is the same God who works all in all.

{7} But the manifestation of the Spirit is given to each one for the profit of all:”



1 Corinthians 12:8-11

“for to one is given the word of wisdom through the Spirit, to another the word of knowledge through the same Spirit, {9} to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healings by the same Spirit, {10} to another the working of miracles, to another prophecy, to another discerning of spirits, to another different kinds of tongues, to another the interpretation of tongues. {11} But one and the same Spirit works all these things, distributing to each one individually as He wills.”



1 Corinthians 12:12–13

“For as the body is one and has many members, but all the members of that one body, being many, are one body, so also is Christ. {13} For by one Spirit we were all baptized into one body—whether Jews or Greeks, whether slaves or free—and have all been made to drink into one Spirit.”
