- Peter was a fisherman; Jesus was the carpenter's son
- This was their business
- Peter and his partners had fished all night and caught nothing
- They are done fishing until the next opportune time
- It's daytime, and Jesus is telling them to go out into the deep and let down their nets for a catch?

- Nevertheless = in spite of; despite anything to the contrary
- Some synonyms:
 - nonetheless; notwithstanding; yet

1. We must obey even though what God says goes against our own reasoning

- God's commands are not according to human wisdom
 - Proverbs 16:25
 - Isaiah 55:8-9

1. We must obey even though what God says goes against our own reasoning

- Consider
 - Abraham & Sarah
 - Genesis 17:15-17; 18:9-12; 21:1-2; Romans 4:17-22
 - Paul
 - Acts 26:9

- 1. We must obey even though what God says goes against our own reasoning
- The gospel is not according to human wisdom
 - 1 Corinthians 1:18-21
 - What God says may seem unreasonable
 - Acts 22:16, yet many objections to baptism
 - Matthew 19:9, yet many objections to
 - One cause for divorce
 - Innocent may suffer too
- Human wisdom and reasoning exalts itself against the knowledge of God
 - 2 Corinthians 10:5

2. We must obey even though what God says goes against our experience or we have no experience in the matter

- What God instructs may very well contradict or be outside of what we have experienced and feel that we know better about
- Consider
 - · Noah
 - Genesis 6:13-22; Hebrews 11:7
- 2 Thessalonians 3:6
 - Yet a Christian may be heard to say I've never seen it result in the restoration of a brother or sister
- Matthew 24:44; 1 Thessalonians 4:16-18
 - I have no experience in this matter; nevertheless, believe and make ready!

3. We must obey even though we have trouble seeing how it will accomplish any good

- Consider
 - Moses
 - Exodus 3:10-11; 5:22-23
 - Naaman
 - 2 Kings 5:11-12

3. We must obey even though we have trouble seeing how it will accomplish any good

- "I don't think they are going to be receptive to the gospel" and so don't teach
 - Romans 1:16
- Preaching and teaching the gospel, yet discouraged by no visible result
 - Isaiah 55:10-11; 1 Corinthians 3:6

3. We must obey even though we have trouble seeing how it will accomplish any good

- Parents teaching their children; doing any good?
 - Ephesians 6:4
- "I've returned good for evil, blessing for cursing with this person, and all I get is more disrespect or more shunning from him"
 - 1 Peter 3:9
- "I've tried to do the right thing toward my unbelieving husband, but I see no results"
 - 1 Peter 3:1-2

4. We must continue to obey even though we are tired and weary

- Do people of God get tired and weary from trials, sorrows, disappointments, just living in this world? Do Christians get tired and weary fighting the fight of faith?
 - Yes
- Elijah
 - 1 Kings 19
- Paul
 - 2 Corinthians 11:27
 - But pressed on
 - 2 Corinthians 4:17-18

4. We must continue to obey even though we are tired and weary

- Let us remember these truths:
 - Matthew 6:34
 - Hebrews 10:23, 32, 37
 - Hebrews 12:1-2
 - Galatians 6:7-9

5. We must obey even though it will cost us personally

- Following God has always come with a cost
 - Abraham
 - Genesis 12:1; Hebrews 11:8-10
 - Moses
 - Hebrews 11:24-27
- Obeying the gospel will cost you something – Luke 14:28-33

5. We must obey even though it will cost us personally

- Obeying the gospel will cost you something
 - Deny yourself
 - Mark 8:34
 - 2 Corinthians 5:14-15
 - Very likely cost you:
 - Friendships Matthew 5:10-11; 1 Peter 4:4
 - Family relationships Matthew 10:34-37
 - Cost you time, energy, money, this world's goods
 - 2 Corinthians 9:6-7

 - 1) Simple trust in God and what God says
 - 2) Respect for His authority

- The words "AT YOUR WORD" demonstrate:
 - 1) Simple trust in God and what God says
 - Abraham demonstrated
 - Genesis 22:1-3; Hebrews 11:17
 - 1 Timothy 4:10

- The words "AT YOUR WORD" demonstrate:
 - 2) Respect for His authority
 - We recognize that supreme, final authority rests within God and His word
 - 2 Timothy 3:16-17
 - All-sufficient
 - Creedbooks? Scholarship of men? Historical, uninspired writings?
 - Not "at thy word"

- The words "AT YOUR WORD" demonstrate:
 - 2) Respect for His authority
 - Matthew 7:21-23
 - Not "at thy word"
 - Colossians 3:17
 - In many places of worship, where is the "thus says the Lord"....the "according to"....the "it is written"....the Scriptures?
- "AT YOUR WORD" is to govern the Christian in every aspect of our life in thoughts, deeds, words, whether individually or collectively

"NEVERTHELESS, AT YOUR WORD I WILL LET DOWN THE NET. AND WHEN THEY HAD DONE THIS, THEY CAUGHT A GREAT NUMBER OF FISH, AND THEIR NET WAS BREAKING"

- God's blessing comes to those who obey!
- To those who obey...
 - In spite of human wisdom and my reasoning to the contrary
 - In spite of my experience to the contrary
 - In spite of any shred of doubt as to what good will come
 - In spite of weariness and toil
 - In spite of personal cost
 - Who have...
 - · Simple trust in God and what God says
 - Respect for His authority
- Obey Jesus AT HIS WORD!
