THE EPISTLE TO THE HEBREWS

• Purpose

- 13:22
- Exhortation: "a calling to one's side"; an appeal, entreaty, encouragement, consolation and comfort; an urging to pursue a certain course of conduct; can include warnings
- This letter was written to urge Hebrew brethren in Christ to persevere *in Christ* and to not fall back into Judaism
- In order to do that, warnings and encouragement are given interspersed with argumentation to show why to demonstrate the superiority of Christ

Now 2:5: "For He has not put the world to come, of which we speak, in subjection to angels"

2:6-8 PSALM 8 SHOWED THAT THE EARTH WAS PUT INTO SUBJECTION TO MAN

"But one testified in a certain place, saying:

'What is man that You are mindful of him, Or the son of man that You take care of him?

You have made him a little lower than the angels;You have crowned him with glory and honor,And set him over the works of Your hands.

{8} You have put all things in subjection under his feet.'

For in that He put all in subjection under him, He left nothing that is not put under him. But now we do not yet see all things put under him."
